PLUMS/DAMSON - Grafted on St Julien A root stock
 A very productive medium vigour rootstock for plums, gages and damsons in all situations. Can be trained as a fan on south facing walls.
 Height: 3.5 – 4m / 11 – 13ft.

Plum Victoria – Self-fertile.

APPLES - Grafted on dwarf root stock MM106

Semi-vigorous rootstock grown as a half standard. Can be trained as a fan or espalier.

Height: 3.5m / 11ft.

Charles Ross – Partially self-fertile.

- Dual purpose apple.
- Cross between Cox's Orange Pippin and Peasgood Nonsuch.
- Pleasant, sweet, lightly aromatic flavour.
- Award of Garden Merit by RHS.
- Spur bearer.
- Harvest: September - October.

Sunset – Self-fertile.

- Similar to Cox but more disease resistant.
- Crisp and juicy fruit with an aromatic flavour.
- Heavy cropper.
- Award of Garden Merit by RHS.
- Spur bearer.
- Harvest: September - October.

Lord Lambourne - Partially self-fertile.

- Dual purpose apple.
- Cross between James Grieve and Worcester Pearmain.
- Crisp, juicy flesh, sweet but with balancing acidity.
- Award of Garden Merit by RHS.
- Spur bearer.
- Harvest: September – October.

Spartan – Self-fertile.

- Dessert apple with sweet, juicy, dark red, crisp fruit.
- Flowers are resistant to spring frost.
- Good disease resistance and suitable for the small garden.
- Spur bearer.
- Harvest: October - November.

PEAR - Grafted on the dwarfest root stock – Quince A.

Semi-dwarf rootstock. Can be grown on light and shallow soils.

Height: 3 – 3.5m / 10 – 11ft.

Concorde – Self-fertile.

- A small tree with compact growth.
- Great reliability and superb flavour.
- Very heavy cropper.
- Award of Garden Merit by RHS.
- Spur bearer.
- Harvest: September.

CHERRIES - Grafted on dwarf Colt root stock.

Semi-vigorous rootstock grown as a half standard. Can be trained as a fan on south facing walls. Very productive when grown in a sheltered situation.

Height: 2 – 3.5m / 7 – 11ft.

Stella – Self-fertile.

- Dessert variety.
- Large sweet, juicy cherries, with good flavour.
- Award of Garden Merit by RHS.
- Harvest: July.

Sunburst – Self-fertile.

- Dessert variety.
- Black sweet cherry.
- Harvest: July.
