

# Alpines March 2020

Alpines are evergreen, low growing and best in a sunny position. They are all a great early food source for bees and butterflies.

Aubrieta – covered in of flowers and more buds.

9cm -£2.50

- **hybrida 'Axcent Violet with Eye'** deep lavender-purple with a tiny yellow eye.
- hybrida 'Audrey Red' deep red flowers.
- hybrida 'Silberand' large violet flowers on variegated foliage.
- **gracilis 'Florado Blue Bicolour'** bi-colour shades of light blue with white flowers.

Pulsatilla – flowers and more buds. 9cm - £2.50

- vulgaris 'Purple' purple flowers over fern-like foliage.
- vulgaris 'Red' red flowers over fern-like foliage.

### Phlox - covered in flower buds. 9cm - £2.50

- **kelseyi** 'Rosette' heart shaped petals, lilac-pink flowers.
- **subulata 'Bavaria'** white star shaped flowers with a dark blue centre.
- subulata 'G.F.Wilson' pearly-blue flowers.

Saxifraga – covered in flowers and more buds.

9cm - £2.50

- x arendsii 'Limerock' short stems bearing upward-facing, cup-shaped, white flowers, flushed yellow-green at the centres
- x arendsii 'Touran Scarlet' short stems bear upward-facing, cup-shaped, scarlet flowers with yellow centres.

#### **Sedum** 9cm - £2.50

- **spathulifolium 'Purpureum'** little purple-grey rosettes, yellow flowers in June.
- **spurium 'Voodoo'** green leaves heavily-flushed with dark red. Clusters of dark reddish-pink, star-shaped flowers are produced on short, upright stems in June.

## **Rhodanthemum** – flowers with more buds.

• **hybrida** 'Casablanca' - finely divided, grey-green leaves with short stems bearing white, daisy-like flowers with orange-brown central discs.

# **Lithospermum** – covered in flower buds. 9cm - £3.00

• 'Heavenly Blue' - Stunning brilliant blue flowers on prostrate stems of deep green foliage.
